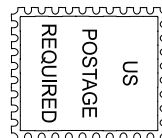

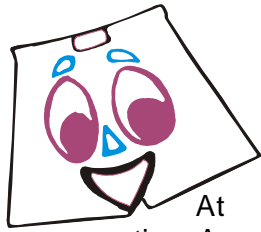


## OUR MYSTERY LION
