Lion Carl worked in the wholesale paper distribution business and owned a janitorial services franchising company. He and wife Lion Tia retired and moved to Mesa in 2007.

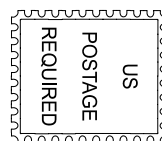

The meeting adjourned at 1 PM.

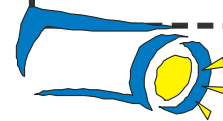
